Drinking & Driving

Teen drivers are 3 times more likely than experienced drivers to be in a fatal crash. Drinking any alcohol greatly increases this risk for teens.



Blood Alcohol Concentration

Driving Under the Influence (DUI) refers to operating a motor vehicle with a Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) that is above the legal limit. In most states the limit is 0.08%. (Utah's BAC was recently lowered to 0.05%.) For people under 21, "zero tolerance" laws make it illegal to drive with any measurable amount of alcohol in their system.

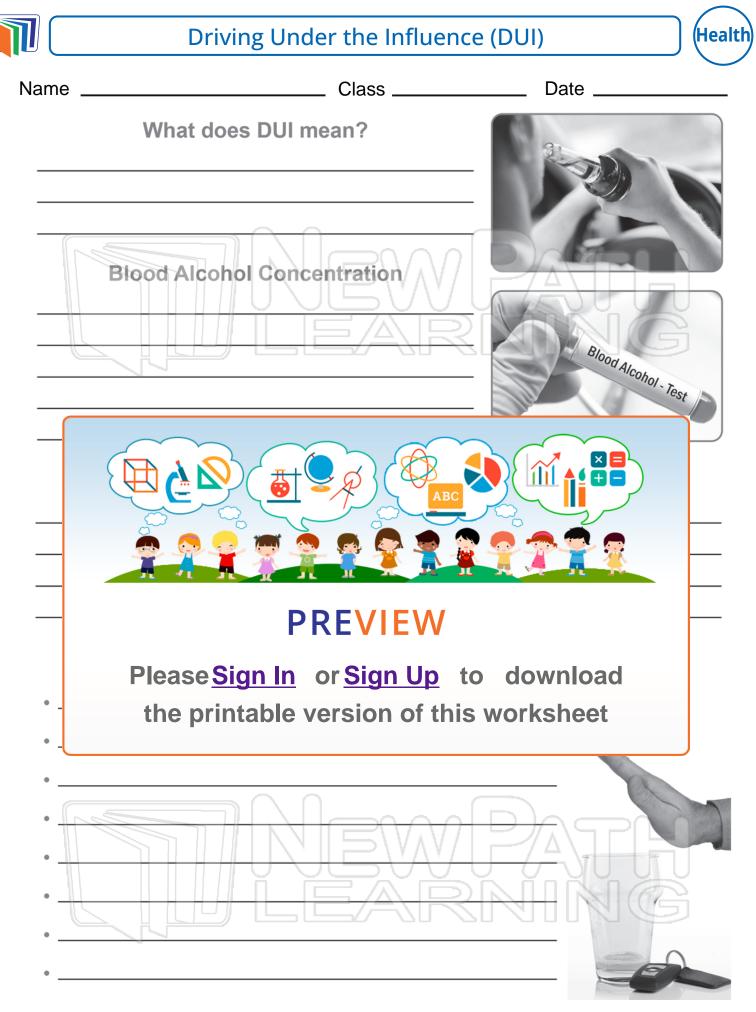
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Help Prevent Drunk Driving. Be Safe!
