What is Unnecessary Information?

When you write a paragraph, story, or report you must include all important information. Sometimes writers put in too much information. It is important to know what to include and what to leave out. The unnecessary information is any part that does not belong.

Example: If you are writing sentences, you might have a word or two that does not belong.
