What is Sequential Order?

Sequential order is the order in which events really happened---real-life order. Figuring out the order in which events really happened will help you to better understand what you read.

Transition words help you figure out sequential order: first, then, finally, next, last, after that, second, before

Example

The first birthday gift I got came from my Mom and Dad. Then, my teacher gave me a little gift at school. Finally, at my party after school, I received ten more presents
