What is Alliteration?

Alliteration is the repetition of the beginning consonant sounds in two or more words.

Example:

David drove down Delaney Drive.

This sentence is an example of alliteration: the consonant D repeats in the first letter of words throughout the sentence.

What is Rhyme?

When two words have a similar sound, they are said to rhyme.



Repetition is often used in poetry to emphasize a point.
