What is Drawing Conclusions?

Drawing a conclusion is a reasonable decision you make based on facts and details in a sentence, paragraph, story, or article.

When you draw a conclusion, you often use information you already know or have learned before.

Example:

Peter put on his hat, scarf, gloves, and jacket and headed outside to play.



Sally round a sear next to her classifiate in the crowded room. She put down her lunch tray and started to eat. She was so hungry.

Where was Sally?
