What is Onomatopoeia?

Onomatopoeia is a word that imitates the sound of that word.

Examples:

hiss boom thump bang

What is Alliteration?

Alliteration is the repetition of initial consonant sounds in a sentence,

The sun kissed the sky. (kiss = human quality given to the sun)

What is Hyperbole?

Hyperbole is the use of an exaggerated or overstated comparison.

Example:

My backpack weighs a ton. (the backpack and ton are being compared)

This hyperbole is used to dramatically state how heavy the backpack felt.



What are Similes?

A **simile** is a figure of speech in which two different things are compared, using the words LIKE or AS.

Examples:

Her smile was as pretty as a sunset.

Similes often create pictures in the reader's mind.

You can use similes to make your writing more interesting.

What is a Metaphor?

A **metaphor** is a figure of speech that compares two unlike things WITHOUT using the words like or as.

Example:

I missed the bus but the sun continued to shine.

My best friend was absent today but the sun continued to shine.

I had to walk home but the sun continued to shine.

The sun continued to shine.
