What Is the Reading Process?

The steps a student follows in reading effectively are called the **reading process**.

Examples:

- A student should **set a purpose**, like information or entertainment, for reading before reading the selection.
- The step in the reading process when a student looks over the selection is called **previewing**.

- Before reading the selection, students should think about what they want to learn or what they want to do.

- A student should preview the selection before reading it.
- During reading, students should think about what is being read.
- After reading, students should think about what he/she has read and reflect.

- Certain genres of literature need to be read more than once. This step in the reading process is called **rereading**.
- The last step in the reading process is to think back and recall what was just read. This step is called **remembering**.
