

READING PROCESS

What Is the Reading Process?

The steps a student follows in reading effectively are called the reading process.

Examples:

 A student should set a purpose, like information or entertainment, for reading before reading the selection.

The step in the reading process when a student looks over the selection is called provious and a student looks.



- Certain genres of literature need to be read more than once. This step in the reading process is called **rereading**.
- The last step in the reading process is to think back and recall what was just read. This step is called **remembering**.
