

## STANDARD UNITS OF MEASUREMENT

# **Measuring LENGTH**

#### Inches:

Used to measure small objects, like a key or eraser





#### Centimeters:

Used to measure small objects, like an eraser

#### Meter

Used to measure even larger objects, like a playground

One **meter** = **100 centimeters** (which is a little longer than 39 inches)

# **Measuring WEIGHT**

#### Ounce:

An **ounce** is a unit of measurement used to measure the weight of an object.

5 nickels weigh about 1 ounce.

#### Pound:

1 pound = 16 ounces

### Kilogram:




Non standard units of measurement can be used when you just need a general idea of about the measurement of length of a certain object.

Non standard units of measurement allow you to easily measure the length an object when you do not have a ruler or other standard measuring devices at hand.



## Hand span



For instance: When you use your hand to measure your desk, you may measure 3 hand spans where as an adult may only measure 2 hand

spans.

# Other non standard units of measurement you could use when measuring:

A paper clip, a pencil, your arm (from elbow to fingertips), a book, or your shoe.
