## What Are Story Problems?

- Story problems are a bunch of sentences set up to give you information in order to solve a problem.
- Story problems most often give you all the information needed to solve the problem. They may even include information you do not need at all.


## How to Solve Story Problems:



## For example:

Tabitha wants to send cards to all of her friends. She has 30 cards to send and has already sent 17. How many more cards does Tabitha need to send?

$$
30-17=13
$$

Tabitha needs to send 13 more cards.
In this example, the question mentions more, but you need to find the difference.

## Here is another example story problem using 'more.'

Brandon has collected 12 baseballs. His friend gives him 5 more baseballs for his birthday. How many baseballs does Brandon have now?

$$
12+5=17
$$

Brandon now has 17 baseballs.
In this example, more is mentioned in the story. The question is asking for a total; that means you need to add.
