

TIME LINES

What is a Time Line?

A **time line** is a horizontal or vertical line divided into sections usually by years, decades, or centuries. A time line shows **important events in history** arranged in chronological order. **Chronological** means in the order they actually happened. Some time lines may show just one subject, such as inventions, space travel, events in the life of one person, or dates of wars.

Here is a time line of some important events in **American history**.

8000 B.C. Native Americans begin to settle North America.

1492 Christopher Columbus sails to an island in the Caribbean. Thinking he has reached India, he calls the natives Indians.

1513 Ponce de Leon explores the coast of what is now Florida.

1607 Jamestown, Virginia is first English settlement on the continent.



1609 Spain begins to settle in New Mexico.

1619 First African slaves are brought to Jamestown.

1620 Mayflower brings the Pilgrims to what is now Massachusetts.

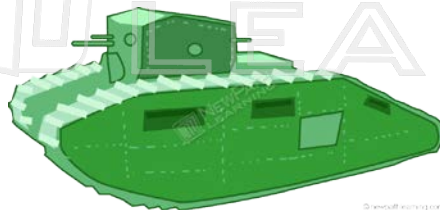
