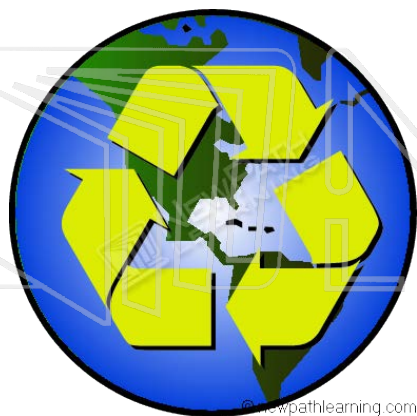
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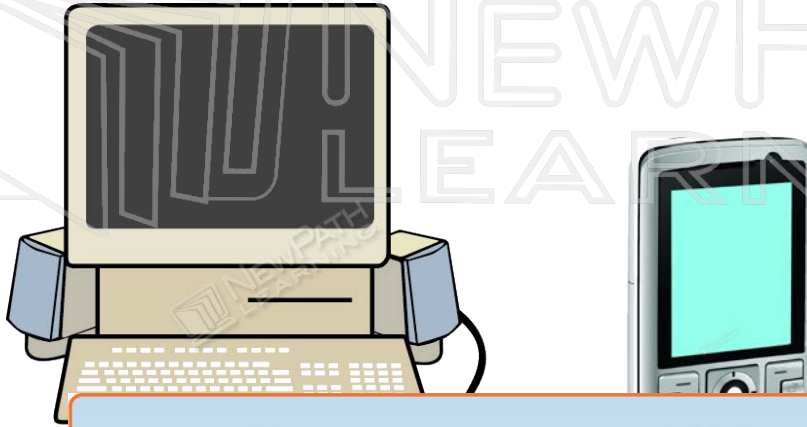
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attribute this to overpopulation while others feel that people can do their part to reduce the damage done to the environment. Recycling, carpooling and reducing uses of key resources are some ways to help.
